VISION OF THE COLLEGE

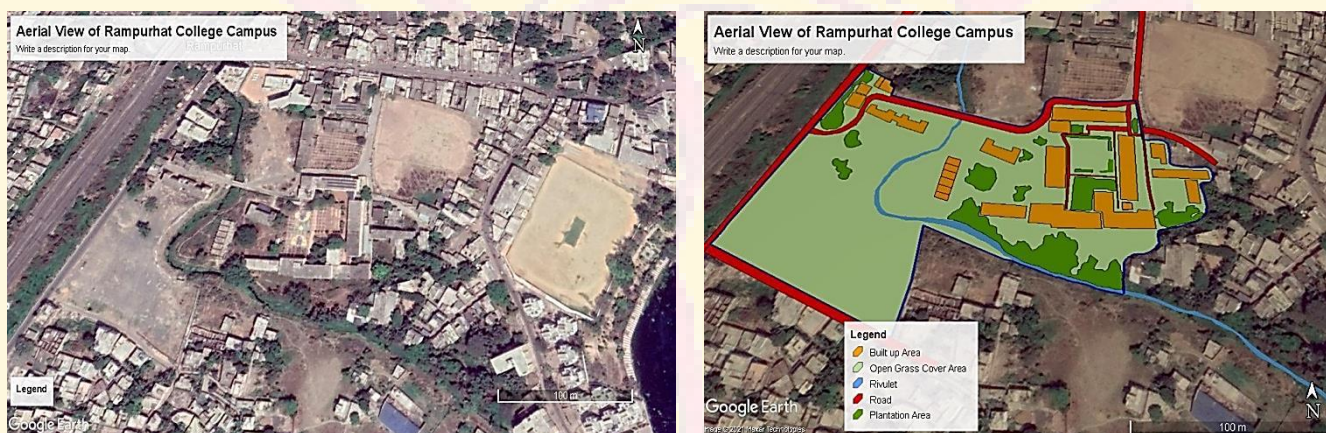

Location of the College

Located within the periphery of a railway colony, Rampurhat College is well-connected by both trains and road transport. The area of the college campus is about eleven acres with multiple buildings intercepted by natural greenery that looks rejuvenating amidst the arid landscape of Rampurhat. The total built-up area of the college shares 13.91% of the whole college campus, consisting of the following heads as stated in the table below. Most of the academic buildings are located in the southern part of the campus. The northern part of the campus comprises administrative buildings, staff room etc. eastern part of the campus is comprised of arts building, boys hostel, canteen etc. staff quarters and girls hostel are located in the western part.

RAMPURHAT COLLEGE

Rampurhat College (Govt. Spons.), established in 1950, has traversed a long path warding off the challenges of time and putting its mark in higher education history. It is affiliated with the University of Burdwan. The college has three shifts-Morning, Day and Evening. Honours & General subjects are taught in the day shift, the morning shift only for the Arts general stream, and the evening shift is exclusively for the Commerce, both Honours & General. Since its inception in 1950 as a lone institute of higher education in the subdivision of Rampurhat and adjacent areas, Rampurhat College has a history of serving society since the post-independence social and political transition. The forces, both external and internal, have initiated the course of its change.

After the independence of the country, in the first two decades of the 50s and when the moral values of all sections of the people, which were created at the time of liberation movement of the country, lingered still strong, the college played a leading role in disseminating education among people of this semi-urban settlement. In the decades of the seventies, there was an upsurge of Naxalite movement in this poverty stricken area. The rebels of this locality put arson to this college building and office, destroying many of the valuable documents and files of the college. Since the decades of the 90s till date tremendous development in the fields of technology and communication system has enabled the institution to serve a large number of students in an organized manner. Bringing the fruits of higher education to an agrarian belt has been a primary aim of the college since its inception. No wonder then that a sizable section of the students of the college are first generation learners belonging to Scheduled Caste, Schedules Tribe and Minority Communities.

The college keeps pace with the National Educational Policy through following the CBCS system since 2017 and by introducing a number of new courses during the last five years with a flexible combination of subjects in Science, Commerce and Humanities streams. Presently it provides 22 existing courses (both Honours & General) in 18 disciplines of Arts, Science and Commerce streams (Bengali, English, Political Science, Philosophy, History, Sanskrit, Economics, Geography, Physical Education (only General course), Music, Education, Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Botany, Zoology, Computer Science (only General Course) & Accountancy). The college has started Postgraduate courses in Bengali, English and Sanskrit in 2014 and 2015 respectively.

Type of the Institution

The College is affiliated to the University of Burdwan and it enjoys the academic and administrative protection under 2(f) and 12(B) acknowledged by UGC and the Department of Higher Education, West Bengal. The college keeps pace with the National educational policy through following the CBCS system since 2017 and by introducing a number of new courses during the last five years with a flexible combination of subjects in Science, Commerce and Humanities streams. Rampurhat College has attained the status of a '**PG College**' by introducing Regular PG Courses in Bengali, English and Sanskrit in 2014 and 2015 respectively. All these courses are running successfully henceforth. The student intake capacity of PG in Bengali is 38, PG in English and PG in Sanskrit has 31 seats each. The admission and the examination process of the 3 PG course are centrally conducted by the University of Burdwan.

From the Principal's Desk

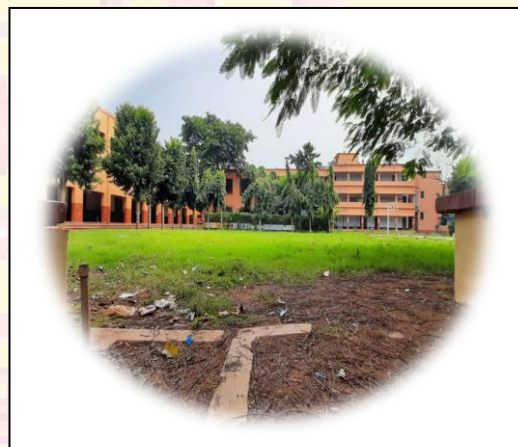

DRAFT OUTLINE OF THE SEMESTER WISE COURSE STRUCTURES OF B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. UNDER THE CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (CBCS)

Under the CBCS there are broadly two course structures-

- Honours Course &
- General Course.

The main components of the courses are as follows:

1. Core Course (CC): A course, that should compulsorily be studied by a candidate as core requirement is termed a core course.
 2. Elective Course (EC): Generally a course, which can be chosen from a pool of courses and which may be very specific or specialized or advanced or supportive to the discipline/subject of study or which provides an extended scope or which enables an exposure to some other discipline/subject/domain or nurtures the candidate's proficiency/skill, is called an Elective Course.
 - 2.1 Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Course: A course, which may be offered by the main discipline/ subject of study, is referred to as Discipline Specific Elective.
 - 2.2 Generic Elective (GE) Course: An elective course, chosen generally from an unrelated discipline/ subject of study with an intention to seek an exposure, is called a Generic Course.
- N.B. - A Core Course, offered in a discipline/subject, may be treated as an elective by other discipline/subject and vice-versa and such electives may also be referred to as Generic Elective.
- 2.3 Dissertation/Project: An elective course, designed to acquire special/advanced knowledge, is termed as dissertation/project. This is considered as a special course involving application of knowledge in solving/analysing/exploring a real-life situation/difficult problem. A dissertation/project work will be of 6 credits. A dissertation/project work may be given in lieu of a Discipline Specific Elective.
3. Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC): The Ability Enhancement (AE) Courses may be of two kinds - Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC) and Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC).
 - 3.1 AECC: These are the courses based on the contents that lead to knowledge enhancement and consist of Environmental Studies & English/MIL Communication. These are mandatory for all disciplines.
 - 3.2 SEC: SECs are value-based and/or skill-based and are aimed at providing hand-on-training, competency, skill etc. It will be minimum 2 for Honours Courses and 4 for General Courses. These may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide value-based and/or skill-based knowledge would contain both theory and lab. /hands-on-training/field work. The main purpose of these courses is to provide the students life-skill in hands-on-mode so as to increase their employability.
- ## Practical/Tutorial: One each with every Core, Discipline Specific and Generic Elective Paper.

An Under-graduate Honours Degree in a discipline may be awarded if a student completes 14 core papers in that discipline, 4 papers each from a list of DSE and GE respectively, 2 papers in AECC and minimum 2 papers in SEC.

An Under-graduate General Degree in Science may be awarded if a student completes 4 core papers each in three disciplines of choice, 2 papers each from a list of DSEs based on the three disciplines of choice selected above, 2 papers in AECC and minimum 4 papers in SEC.

An Under-graduate General Degree in Humanities/Social Sciences/Commerce may be awarded if a student completes 4 core papers each in two disciplines of choice along with 2 core papers each in two Languages from English, Bengali and Hindi respectively, 2 papers each from a list of DSEs based on the two disciplines of choice selected above and 2 papers from the list of GEs, 2 papers in AECC and minimum 4 papers in SEC.

* Wherever there is a practical, there will be no tutorial and vice-versa.

The evaluation of the candidates shall be based on continuous assessment. The structure of evaluation shall be as follows:

- Each semester-assessment shall be divided into four (4) discrete components, viz. C1, C2, C3 and C4. The students are informed about the modalities of continuous assessment activities well in advance.

For B. A. & B. Com. (Hons. & Gen.) Courses, having no practical, distribution of 75 marks will be as follows:

- Class Attendance cum Internal Assessment: 20% of 75 marks = 15 marks of which 5 marks be reserved for class attendance (both theoretical + tutorial) in the following manner:

Attendance 50% & above but below 60% - 2 marks

Attendance 60% & above but below 75% - 3 marks

Attendance 75% & above but below 90% - 4 marks

Attendance 90% & above - 5 marks

and 10 marks be reserved for class test/assignment/seminar (theoretical - 5 & tutorial - 5).

- ii) In the Semester-end Examination of each course, Question Paper to be set for 60 marks, distribution of which may be as under:

a) Answer 10 questions out of 15 carrying 2 marks each: $10 \times 2 = 20$

b) Answer 4 questions out of 06 carrying 5 marks each: $4 \times 5 = 20$

c) Answer 2 questions out of 4 carrying 10 marks each: $2 \times 10 = 20$

However, questions, carrying 05 or 10 marks, need not necessarily to be a single question.

For B. Sc. (Hons. & Gen.) Courses, having practical, distribution of 75 marks be as follows:

- Class Attendance cum Internal Assessment: 20% of 75 marks = 15 marks of which 5 marks be reserved for theoretical class attendance in the following manner:
Attendance 50% & above but below 60% - 2 marks
Attendance 60% & above but below 75% - 3 marks
Attendance 75% & above but below 90% - 4 marks
Attendance 90% & above - 5 marks
and 10 marks be reserved for class test/assignment/seminar (theoretical - 5 & practical - 5).

- After online admission (provisional) and online payment of fees, candidates have to bring a copy of online application form along with the originals of the relevant documents (noted below) for verification. The online application form must be submitted to the college authorities along with the self-attested photocopies of the following documents –

- After admission to the 1st Semester the student has to fill up the University of Burdwan's Online Registration-cum-Enrollment Form subject to the relevant notice issued by the College.

LIBRARY & BOOK BANK

The Central Library of the college is fully automated. It is well-equipped to cater to the needs of the students. The College Library is situated in the second floor of the Library building of the College. About 3000 Sq.ft. is the total carpet area of the central Library. Library has a collection of more than 36,000 books on various subjects offered by the college along with books on religion, biography, different types of dictionary, encyclopaedia etc. The library subscribes a number of journals and daily newspapers such as: Economic and Political Weekly, Journal of Indian Chemical Society, Ekakmatra, Polyphony, Aajkal. There is a single reading room at the central library. Students are not allowed to retain the books for than 2 weeks. A fine will be imposed if the books are not returned within 28 days. There is also the provision for book bank facility for the needy and meritorious students. Students are also allowed to avail overnight issue of books. All students are required to return the books before the filling up the form for final examination.

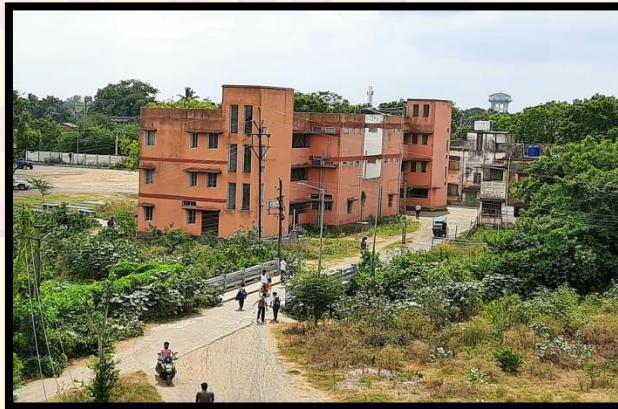
